

## 2018 ATA European Trainer Forum

Participant Feedback Report

- Out of 76 attendees, we received evaluation responses from 34:
  - 6 Interns, 5 Associates, 13 Leads, 9 Professionals, and 1 other
- What was your favorite part of the Forum? Below is a summarized list of responses:
  - Engagement: Connecting, sharing, and networking with peers
  - Small group and break out discussions many participants acknowledged how much they enjoyed their time with peers in a more intimate format.
  - Workshops: participants voiced the caliber of workshops, which set a new standard for the Forum moving forward.
  - Participants appreciated meeting in large group (Global Decision Making) that addressed pressing topics within the Academy and greater community.
  - Chateau Anand: this setting offers a tranquil and inspiring backdrop to the Forum. Many noted how much they take pleasure in being there.
  - Presentation videos: "Known for Our Service," Translations, and Library of Teachings
- What was your least favorite part of the Forum? Below is a summarized list of responses:
  - Breaks were little to none
  - The group discussion after lunch was too long; this is made it difficult for participants to stay focused on important topics.
  - Too many themes, not enough focus
- What would you like to see improved? Below is a summarized list of responses:
  - Many participants would like small group discussions and "hot topics" to take place on the first day and/ or in the morning.
  - Event dates to be shared as early as possible
  - More yoga and meditation with the group
  - Transportation to the venue
  - Food
  - Clear instructions during large and small group discussions
  - 1 2 page brief before the Forum (ie what changes KRI is proposing)
  - Distance meetings via Zoom
  - Time management
  - Cost cut down

  - Support for elder teachers
  - Transparency, structure, and decision making of KRI & 3HO
  - Improvements in technology
