The Teacher Training Executive Committee (TTEC) has been the vehicle for trainers to participate in the decision making process regarding Teacher Training and Aquarian Trainer Academy Programs and Policies. Whereas the Trainer Forums are more focused on connecting and sharing, and giving input; TTEC is more focused on decision making.

TTEC, which used to be 20-30 people meeting twice a year in Espanola, has expanded in the past two years with meetings taking place in Europe and South America as well as New Mexico. On September 20, 21, and 22 the Academy will have its first online Global TTEC meeting. For this experiment in large group decision making to work, for the voices of trainers with different opinions and expertise to be heard, time and participation is needed.

Your time and participation is needed for this process to effectively represent both your community and yourself.

As has been the tradition at TTEC - the first day will be a dialog day - a time to talk openly and frankly about what is important. This allows us to connect with one another in a space of deep listening, and to sink into the group consciousness. For us to collectively make decisions, we need this time to establish a group consciousness online. For this day we are envisioning small breakout sessions around the following questions:

- Has the release of the report by AOB affected my relationship to the teachings and to Yogi Bhajan?
- How has my identity as a trainer been affected?

Day 2 will be when we hope to make some collective decisions. The decisions fall into two categories: setting direction and specific policy changes. We urgently need to address the following very specific questions:

- Can 100% of a Level One training program <u>be delivered online</u>? And
- Will we change (and if so, in what ways) our <u>Level One certification requirements</u> around White Tantric Yoga, The Masters Touch book, and the Yogi Bhajan videos?

It is critical to prepare for TTEC by reading these draft proposals linked above and comment.

To help set priorities and specific directions for future work, we will take the notes from the Global Trainer Summit and frame some key questions that the group will vote on as well.

At the moment, we envision Day 3 of TTEC being a space where smaller groups gather to actually work together making progress on the topics, and in the directions set by the votes of Day 2. Though as the TTEC Steering Committee is still working on the agenda, all of this is subject to change.

Please mark your calendar to attend the TTEC meetings on Sept 20, 21 and 22. We will try our best to provide translation. Like the Global Summit, there will be two "tracks" or daily time slots available, with each covering the same agenda items (so the expectation is that you will only attend one of the two tracks). <u>Please register here</u> for the time slot that works for you. There is the possibility that we may need to go one hour longer at least on Day 1, but the expected times are:

- Track 1 will be 8:00-12:00 CEST and
- Track 2 will be 17:00 21:00 CEST
